

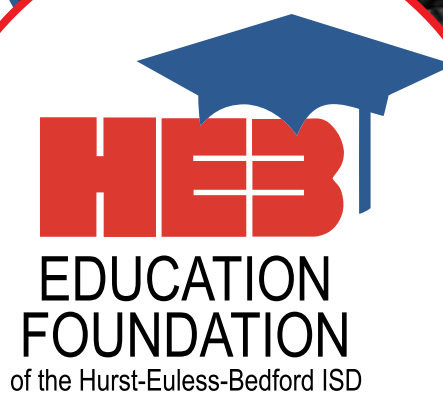

New Professionals Lunch, Campus Visits, Board Meetings, HEB Reads, Awards of Excellence, Empowered to Excel Grants, and Superintendent's Circle of Giving are among the highlights of 2018-2019

2018-2019 YEAR IN REVIEW

PROGRAMS

- Planned and executed 4th annual New Professionals Luncheon, hosting 350 new HEB ISD staff members and guests. Texas Roadhouse provided catering once again and recommitted to 2019-2020 and on-going support. Rita's Ice and Moonlight Cupcakes provided mouthwatering desserts.
- Expanded Campus Liaison Program to include a new staff campaign week.
- Continued Awards of Excellence program, which recognizes 33 outstanding high school seniors in 14 areas of study and their teacher mentors at L.D. Bell, Trinity, KEYS, and BCTEA. Elected officials provided certificates and proclamations honoring the students including their names listed in the Congressional Record.
- Honored the life and legacy of the late Georgia Kidwell, Foundation Board Member, at the Awards of Excellence by providing the Georgia Kidwell Memorial Award and \$1,000 scholarship to an outstanding student and \$1,000 to Bellaire Elementary for teacher tools.
- Diverse and thoughtful grant review committee of 17 members recommended funding 29 grants for a total of \$92,869.71.
- Awarded 29 grants to 14 campuses through Grant Patrol events on May 20-28th.

OUTREACH AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- Communications Committee continued to work to raise profile of the Foundation and share stories.
- Developed video in partnership with HEB ISD PR & Marketing for Convocation and use in promotional materials.
- Communications Committee created and executed marketing strategy using social media.
- Created and disseminated 6th annual Report to Community.
- Fourth Parent Outreach initiative during the holiday inviting parents to donate to the Foundation in honor of HEB ISD teachers and staff. Generated \$1,265 in donations from 69 unique donors with 78 tribute gifts.
- Participated in HEB Chamber of Commerce State of the District Luncheon.
- Participated in HEB Chamber of Commerce EXPO 2018 on June 5th at the Hurst Conference Center.
- Hosted Superintendent's Circle of Giving Spring Reception at Hilton Garden Inn-Hurst and announced the recommitment of NTE Mobility Partners, Atmos Energy and Judge Glen Whitley to jumpstart the 2019-2020 Superintendent's Circle of Giving Annual Campaign with \$28,000.
- Presented Community Outreach presentation to Council of PTAs, HEB ISD Board of Trustees, and HEB ISD Principals.
- Coordinated NTE visit to South Euless Elementary for STEM funding in action.
- Coordinated donor visit to Viridian Elementary to see a grant in action resulting in increased funding from the donor.
- Attended Adopters Reception and awarded winning campuses funds in honor of their selected adopter.
- Participated in HEB Reads and distributed "superhero" bookmarks.

ORGANIZATION STRUCTURE & BOARD DEVELOPMENT

- Oriented three new high quality board members in the work of the Foundation.
- Elected two former board members with expiring terms to serve as "Directors Emeritus".
- Reported to HEB ISD 1,673 total volunteer hours from Board Members supporting the mission of HEB ISD.

FUNDRAISING & FINANCIAL

- Fundraising resulted in total revenue of \$280,003.65 which included one-time gifts from NTE, Bell, THR Pennington Field Scoreboard Donation, and North Texas Giving Day.
- The Staff Appeal in its 5th year included over 775 staff donors with total donations of over \$35,000. The program expanded to a week-long campaign with the theme ARE YOU IN? Inspire, Innovate, Invest. The successful initiative was supported by the business community through incentive giveaways and programming support.
- Facilitated gift of \$15,000 from NTE for HEB ISD Elementary STEM programming.
- Participated in Tiff's Treats 20th Anniversary promotion raising awareness and funds through a cookie purchase program.

Georgia Kidwell
1932 - 2018

In November 2018, we lost a dear friend, board member, and servant leader. Georgia was a dedicated community volunteer serving more than a decade on the Education Foundation Board. She taught for more than 20 years in the Hurst-Euless-Bedford ISD most notably at Bellaire Elementary where she taught second grade. She was passionate about educating the whole child. Her legacy lives on in the program of work of the Education Foundation and the numerous organizations to which she devoted countless hours, ensuring every child had a pathway to success.

EMPOWERED TO EXCEL

INNOVATIVE GRANT PROGRAM

The HEB ISD Education Foundation funded 25 Empowered to Excel grants for \$60,974 for the 2018-2019 school year.

Since its inception, the Education Foundation has raised and awarded more than \$947,000 to our deserving HEB ISD classrooms and campuses. The grant awards have included initiatives like teaching history through virtual reality, 3D printing for Occupational Therapy and connecting to the International Space Station just to name a few.

TECHNOLOGY GRANT MAKES BEAUTIFUL MUSIC

Band teachers from Bedford Junior High were no longer left guessing when assessing student mastery of music. Thanks to a \$2,035 grant from the HEB ISD Education Foundation, teachers Michaela Davis and Kristin Johnson were able to purchase laptops and professional microphones. This technology was utilized by students in practice rooms to record themselves playing and digitally turn in their assignments.

“Previously, recordings sounded like they were underwater and at times we couldn’t tell what instrument was being played,” Davis shared. “Now it takes less time for students to complete assignments because of the high quality of recordings. I believe students feel more successful when they’re able to complete assignments with ease instead of struggling with technology.”

The recordings are graded and used to determine a student’s musical mastery of band literature. In the future, Davis and Johnson hope to also include technology that will allow students to incorporate music notation and music theory.

OUR WORLD LANGUAGES GRANT INCREASES READING SCORES

Did you know there are **78 languages spoken by students in HEB ISD**? The district is diverse and home to students who come from many different countries. Hurst Hills Elementary Librarian Holly Riggs recognized that her school was home to 93 English Language Learners and applied for a \$1,000 grant from the HEB ISD Education Foundation to purchase high-interest library books in Arabic, Spanish and Vietnamese.

The students had the opportunity to read the books and then complete Reading Counts tests. Riggs compiled the data and found that on average across all grades, **the students Lexile reading scores increased 74 points over the course of one year.**

Students read with parents in their home language and it helped them learn new concepts easier.

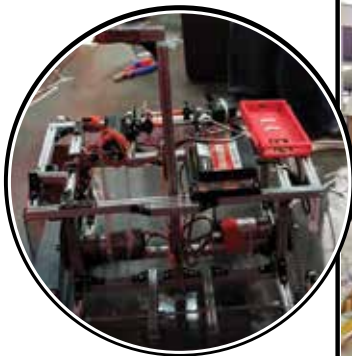
“I loved seeing the student’s faces when they found books in their home languages,” Riggs shared. “We had several students start the year knowing no English at all and they were still able to enjoy reading for pleasure as they worked to learn English.”



After review by the district’s leadership team, our volunteer committee conducts a blind review of the grant applications and selects the based on a published rubric. Grant requests up to \$1,000 are awarded to individual teachers. Grant requests up to \$5,000 are awarded to campuses or district teams.

ROBOTICS GRANT FUNDING LEADS TO A WORLD COMPETITION

Robots are no longer science fiction at the HEB ISD Buinger Career and Technical Academy (BCTEA) and Junior High STEM programs. Each day you'll find students building competition worthy robots and working with drones while determining payload and how to most effectively transport items. A strong robotics program can lay the foundation for a career at the cutting edge of science, or, at the very least, a better understanding of the different ways technology can be used to solve real-world problems.



Throughout the year, students go through the design process, prototyping, programming and finally putting their work into action. However, Derek Thorn, Robotics and Engineering teacher at BCTEA, knew he needed the right supplies to take his students to the next level in competition, so he applied for a \$5,000 grant from the HEB ISD Education Foundation to purchase four REV Robotics Competition Kits. The grant review committee approved the grant and it was funded, thanks to donors like Bell Flight who support the Education Foundation's program of work and make the grant program possible.



"If it wasn't for the funds this year, we would have had a very limited amount of supplies to build a competition level robot for all our teams," Thorn shared. "Each team was able to build 2 different types of chassis to compare/contrast to see which platform would be the best for competition this year. This allowed more students to be able to have a hands-on experience inside and outside the classroom."

The additional funds from the grant paid off. **BCTEA Tech Challenge Robotics Team 6169 Men in Black** made it to the First World Competition in Houston in April. Our students competed against teams from countries such as Australia, China and the United Arab Emirates. Due in part to their increased experience, they placed in the top 15% of 180 teams.



"The Worlds competition opened my eyes to the vast amount of solutions to the same problems and how little changes can make a difference," said Robotics Team member Jack. "I have always wanted to be an engineer, but the hands-on side reinforced my want to pursue mechanical engineering in college."

Thanks to HEB ISD Education Foundation donors, teachers like Derek Thorn are able to take their programs and students to the next level when preparing them for life and careers.

March 21, 2019 was a night of celebration at the 19th Annual HEB ISD Education Foundation's Awards of Excellence dinner. The Foundation recognized 33 outstanding high school seniors and their teacher mentors in 14 fields of study from L.D. Bell, Trinity, KEYS and the Buinger CTE Academy.



More than 250 awardees, family members, elected officials, Education Foundation supporters, community leaders, and school district officials attended the event and enjoyed a dinner catered by the HEB ISD Child Nutrition Services Department.

Each student awardee received a medal and certificates from State Rep. Jonathan Stickland, State Senators Kelly Hancock and Beverly Powell. Tarrant County Commissioner Gary Fickes also provided each recipient with a certificate of recognition. Teacher Mentor honorees were also provided certificates and a commemorative photo plaque.

Special recognition from Congressman Kenny Marchant included an official copy of the Congressional Record in which each of the student names and teacher names were listed as Congressman Marchant presented them in the U.S. Congress. The original Congressional Record is kept in the Library of Congress.
